We welcome our own district governor, Bill Wylie, from the Rotary Club of Romney. He plans to address four areas: the trend of Rotary membership in the United States, District Youth Programs, Rotary Leadership Institute, and the District Conference.

Bill is a native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and received his degree in business administration from Pace University after serving in the U.S. Army from 1965 to 1968.

After working in retail for JC Penney and McCrory Corp., he became self-employed as a manufacturer of children's wear and created a company known as G&W Industries.

A member of the Rotary Club of Romney since 1995, Bill served his club as president during the 2005–2006 Rotary year. He is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow. Bill chairs the club's Literacy Fund which purchases library books for local schools yearly. He co-chairs the local "WARM THE CHILDREN" annual program for Hampshire County, raising over \$25,000 yearly to purchase new warm winter clothing for needy children. He also co-chairs the high school scholarship fund-raising effort yearly, raising \$10,000 each year to be used for local high school students. Bill spearheaded the creation of the first Interact Club within Hampshire County High School.

Bill is past president of the Romney Business and Professional Organization uniting local businesses to fulfill community needs.

Bill and his wife Fran, a retired school-teacher/librarian, have been married for 42 years. They are parents to a son, William, a Rotarian and the 2007–2008 past

president of the Romney Rotary Club. They also have two daughters, Jennifer and Elizabeth. Bill and Fran are blessed with three granddaughters and one grandson. In his leisure time, Bill enjoys reading, golfing, and traveling.

May 9, 1919, to Aug. 24, 2010, of Shepherdstown, died in his sleep at Willow Tree Manor.

Understanding Jefferson County's School Excess Levy Renewal November 2, 2010

Today

A. Scott Sudduth, Esq., serving his second term on the Jefferson County Board of Education, is with us today to explain the school excess levy renewal, on the ballot for November 2.

Trained as a lawyer, Sudduth has brought nearly 30 years of public service and experience in higher education to his service on the Jefferson County Board of Education. Currently he works in D.C. as associate vice president for federal relations for the University of Chicago, focusing on policy issues related to college access and affordability and federal research funding.

Prior to joining Chicago, Sudduth served in a similar capacity for the University of California System. He left Capitol Hill in 1993 to become assistant vice chancellor for the University of Texas, his undergraduate alma mater, where he focused on building public-private partnerships with government and industry focused on research, education, and economic development.

Sudduth has chaired numerous committees and boards committed to higher education, and has served as a chief of staff in the U.S. House of Representatives, and in a variety of senatorial legislative and advisory roles. He has also held several senior positions in the private sector.

Sudduth and his wife, Alice, have two children enrolled in the Jefferson County school system and live on a farm in the Middleway district. His family has resided in the Shenandoah Valley and Jefferson County for more than eight generations. He also serves on the Board of the Bardane Farmers Market.
